## OVERVIEW

*Susan Gonders:* "What is CEPR?" More than 30 university programs in the U.S., Canada, Europe, South America and New Zealand have earned PRSA's quality-assurance endorsement for studies in public relations.

## CEPR VALUE and BENEFITS

*John Paluszek:* "How does CEPR benefit students, academic programs, the profession and PRSA?" Certified programs are better equipped to acquire resources, students have an edge in the competition for internships and jobs, the profession gets a stronger entry level workforce, and PRSA is recognized for "The Global Standard in public relations education."

## CEPR STANDARDS

*Judith Phair:* "How does a program qualify for certification?" Programs at the undergraduate and/or master's degree levels are assessed according to indigenously appropriate application of the eight CEPR standards for curriculum, faculty, resources, students, assessment, professional affiliations, relationships, and diversity and global perspectives.

## CEPR PROCESS

*Susan Gonders:* "What are the procedures for CEPR application and review?" After a school submits an application and \$300 fee, a two-person review team is scheduled for a site visit. The team's report is reviewed by the co-chairs before submission to the whole of Educational Affairs. The PRSA Board considers the Educational Affairs recommendation, and certification is conferred at the PRSA International Conference. Six-year recertification reviews ensure continued quality public relations education.

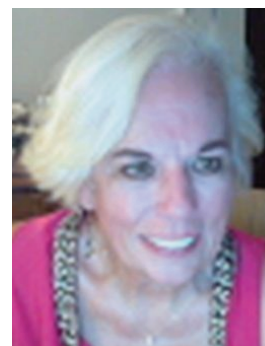
